## About

Brew House Arts (BHA) is a nonprofit art center on Pittsburgh's South Side providing creative space and support for people to connect and expand their relationship with the arts. Brew House Arts (BHA) provides a wide range of creatives with the support needed to foster invention, creation, and collaboration. Our spaces, programs, and people encourage the pursuit of artistic excellence.

BHA is searching for committed and enthusiastic volunteers to join their Board of Directors. Board members are the organization's decision-makers and ambassadors, providing leadership in the Strategic Plan's oversight and execution. It is essential that they share in BHA's values for the arts and community building.

BHA aims to:

- Foster pathways for collaboration and exchange between neighbors
- Encourage mentorship at various stages of artistic development
- Offer an accessible and affordable atmosphere for experimentation and creative risk taking
- Increase social awareness through representation of non-mainstream perspective

## Responsibilities

Board members are required to attend board meetings, which meet every other month, and serve on committee(s) that meet during alternate months as needed. All board and committee meetings mainly meet using video conferencing with occasional meetings in person. Each term is three years, and there is a two-term limit. Approximate time commitment is 3-8 hours per month. Board members are expected to contribute financially in an amount and frequency that is meaningful to them. Board members act as advocates for BHA in their communities, neighborhoods, and online.

## Qualifications

The most critical qualifications for new board members are enthusiastic interest and a commitment to showing up. For the term beginning in July 2026, **special consideration will be given to candidates with experience in legal, HR/ personnel, fundraising, marketing/ PR, or people who are South Side residents, professional artists, or work in the arts on a national scale.** Board members should have an interest in cultivating and growing relationships. Previous service on a non-profit board is preferred but not required.

**Underrepresented candidates, including black and non-black people of color, people with disabilities, speakers of languages besides English, and people who identify as LGBTQ+, are strongly encouraged to apply.** Interested candidates should send a letter of interest and resume to [info@brewhousearts.org](mailto:info@brewhousearts.org).
